Daily routines

- The children should arrive by 8.45am each day and, when the whistle blows, line up on the infant playground. If your child is late they will need to sign in at the office so they can be registered.
- At the end of the day the children will be seen out of their classroom door.
- There is a separate KS1 playtime. Our playtime is at 10.25 and lasts 15 minutes (Friday 10.45am – whole school).
- All infant children are provided with a free healthy snack.
- In Year 1 we will have our drinks and snacks before/during playtime.
- Lunchtime is at 12.00 1.00pm.
- Children with lunch boxes need to put them on the red trolley in the playground before they line up in the morning.

Child initiated learning

Transition from Reception to Year 1 As part of the transition into Year 1, it is important that the children still have some quality time to learn through their play.



PE

- We have PE on Wednesday (Indoor) and Thursday (Outdoor).
- Children should come to school wearing their PE kits on PE days. They will stay in their kit all day.
- The main focus of PE each term is as follows:

Autumn 1	Gymnastics/ Ball Skills & Games
Autumn 2	Dance/ Throwing & Catching
Spring 1	Gymnastics/ Bat & Ball Skills, Skipping
Spring 2	Dance/ Athletics
Summer 1	Gymnastics/ Athletics
Summer 2	Dance/ Developing Partner Work

Reading

- Reading is the key to success in many areas of the curriculum and we give it a high priority. We are following the Little Wandle Phonics scheme which will include reading practice sessions.
- We have a minimum of two reading sessions a week with an adult in small groups.
- The children will develop three areas of their reading through these sessions.
- 1) Developing decoding including vocabulary building
- 2) Prosody, where we learn to read with meaning, fluency and intonation (using expression when reading)
- 3) Developing comprehension skills
- Your child will be given books that are linked to their phonics ability (Little Wandle e-book). They will be ones they have read in school with an adult. They are expected to read these books with good fluency (95% accuracy at home).
- They will also take home a best-matched phonics book (hard copy) from a range of other books we have in school.
- When they have finished reading the book at home, please comment 'finished'. You are
 welcome to make further comments about how they read.
- Your child is responsible for handing in their book and reading record when they are completed.
- Please listen to your child read regularly at home and ask them questions about the book
 at least 4 x weekly for 10 minutes.
- We also ask for you to read to your child as much is possible we will also be sending home a sharing book which the adults will read to the children.

Reading

Shared reading: the adult reads and makes overt what good readers do through modelling good reading behaviours.

Reading practice is the main teaching slot. Children should be able to read the text with 90-95% accuracy.

Independent reading: children read with little adult help. They should be able to read the text with 95% - 100% accuracy.

Home learning

Home learning activities.

- We will send home the 'home learning activity' on a Friday and collect this in on a Wednesday.
- The home learning will include:
- ❖a maths activity, e.g. times tables, number bonds
- spelling practice of key words
- phonics activity


Home learning

Home learning activities.

- Any activities we give the children consolidate and extend the learning they do at school. We aim to help children develop a love of learning across the curriculum.
- We would appreciate your support with homework:
 - encourage your child to look after their home learning books/sheets and take a pride in their work
 - provide a suitable place, away from TV, mobile phones and other distractions, in which home learning can be completed, whether working alone or with an adult
 - monitor home learning and inform the class teacher if an issue arises
 - support your child to plan their time and meet deadlines

Phonics screening

- The children will take the Phonics Screening Check in June.
- The children will be asked to read a range of 'real' and 'alien' words to assess their phonic understanding.



- Parents receive the results with the end of year school report.
