Daily routines

- The children should arrive by 8.45am each day and, when the whistle blows, line up on the KS1 playground. If your child is late they will need to sign in at the office so they can be registered.
- At the end of the day the children will be seen out of their classroom door. Please phone the school office if there are any changes to normal pick up.
- There are separate KS1 and KS2 playtimes Monday to Thursday. Our playtime is at 10.25 and lasts 15 minutes. On a Friday we all go out at 10.45 following a whole school assembly.
- All infant children are provided with a free healthy snack.
- Lunchtime is from 12.00 1.00.

PE

- We have PE on Monday and Tuesday.

- The main focus of PE each term is as follows:

Reading

- Reading is the key to success in many areas of the curriculum and we give it a high priority.
- We aim to have two practise reading sessions a week with an adult

Session 1- Developing decoding including vocabulary building and prosody, where we learn to read with meaning, fluency and intonation

Session 2- Developing comprehension skills

- You child will be given books that are aligned to their reading ability. They should be able to read these mostly accurately and may have read them to an adult in school, prior to coming home.
- When they have finished reading the book at home, please comment 'finished'. You are welcome to make further comments about how they have read.
- Your child is responsible for handing in their book and reading record when they have read the book.
- Please listen to your child read regularly at home and ask them questions about the book – at least 4 x weekly for 10 minutes.
- We also ask for you to read to your child as much as possible.

Reading

Shared reading: the adult reads and makes overt what good readers do through modelling good reading behaviours. These books are to be enjoyed together. Practise reading sessions are the main teaching slot. Children should be able to read the text with 90-95% accuracy and are guided through these with an adult.



Independent reading: children read with little adult help. They should be able to read the text with 95% - 100% accuracy. This will help support them develop reading with greater fluency. These will be the books they bring home to read to you.

Reading – book bingo

Alongside our reading we use Book Bingo. This encourages the children to read across a range of genres and read books by different authors.



Phonics screening

- Those children who did not meet the required standard in the summer will retake the screening in June 2024 alongside the Year 1 pupils.

Home learning

- Home learning activities.
- Home learning will come home on a Friday. It is due in the following Wednesday.
- Any activities we give the children consolidate and extend the learning they do at school. We aim to help children develop a love of learning across the curriculum.
- We would appreciate your support with homework:
 - encourage your child to look after their home learning books/sheets and take pride in their work
 - provide a suitable place, away from TV, mobile phones and other distractions, in which home learning can be completed, whether working alone or with an adult
 - monitor home learning and inform the class teacher if an issue arises
 - support your child to plan their time and meet deadlines.



Please encourage your child to use Times Tables Rock Stars at home, as it is a motivational and challenging way to develop and consolidate times tables knowledge. This can be downloaded as an app for tablets and phones.

Your child's login details will be sent home soon.

Remember it is better to play more often and for less time. For example, 3 or 4 times a week for 15 minutes, than in one big go!

End of KS1 assessments

 2023 was the last year of statutory tests at the end of KS1 (Year 2 SATs). The government will be producing non-statutory tests which schools can choose to use if they wish. A decision will be taken on this soon and we will inform you.


