<p>Key Achievements to date:</p> <p>Sports Ambassador have continued to develop their role within the school, running lunchtime clubs, tennis festival for KS1 with the support of WHSSP.</p> <p>Awarded with the School Games Gold Mark Award for 2022-23 for KS2 and the WHSSP Gold Award for KS1/FS: this a Government led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust, to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community.</p> <p>Following the CPD they received last year, teachers feel more confident about teaching certain elements of the gymnastics curriculum, some staff feel like they would still benefit from further support/training. Pupils were very positive about the quality of gymnastics lessons from the specialist teacher.</p> <p>Lots of extra-curricular opportunities for pupils throughout the school through taster days/sessions led by a qualified coach, e.g. boxing, scooting, tennis, cricket.</p> <p>The KS2 university sports continue to be successful and very popular, external clubs and sports day followed a family picnic lunch were all very well received by the school community.</p>	<p>Areas for further improvement:</p> <p>Continue to work towards maintaining the School Games Gold Mark Award.</p> <p>Develop links across Aspire by providing opportunities for pupils to participate in inter school competitions.</p>
